Dorset's coastline hereabouts is so important that it has been awarded World Heritage Site status and it is heaven for anyone who enjoys walking. You can either go along the breathtaking coastal path, or inland along a multitude of paths, most well-marked, all clear from Ordnance Survey maps, through largely unspoilt and really quiet countryside.

A little further, and you can reach the top of Golden Cap, at 656 ft the highest point on the South Coast, and be rewarded with unbelievable views.
